They stopped in the early hours at Leicester Forest East, the only service station that allowed football coaches to pull in at the time and which soon became known as the place to catch fans travelling north or south. They got there so late after the problems in London that they met coaches of West Ham going up to Huddersfield early for an FA Cup match. They were the last people West Ham expected to see at 4am and the lads gave the Cockneys a kicking, chasing some along the hard shoulder and others through some turnip fields. The Leeds crew then decided to go straight to Huddersfield and hang about there for the match. They went in the Cowshed end, fought with West Ham again and didn't get home until Sunday dinner time, having set off on Friday.
